#### **SECRETARY'S REPORT**

I am glad to share with you that your Association has crossed a few milestones this year.

The membership has crossed 2000 mark. With the increasing membership, the visibility of your Association has also improved. We are being consulted by SIPCOT & TNPCB for their various initiatives.

#### **SIPCOT:**

SIPCOT has identified IWMA as a facilitator for establishing Common TSDF in the identified landfill sites in Tamil Nadu. SIPCOT has allocated sites in Perundurai and Thoothukudi, for which your Association is processing the Environmental Clearance for establishing Common TSDF. Thoothukudi project Terms of Reference (TOR) for conducting EIA has been obtained. EIA studies are under progress.

Perundurai project, a presentation was made to SEIAA, Tamil Nadu. SEIAA had asked additional details on present conditions on environmental quality, which have been provided.

IWMA is continuing to pursue with SIPCOT for allotment of balance 40 acres of land in Gummidipoondi.

#### **TNPCB:**

Co-ordination with TNPCB has been strengthened and I am glad to inform you that IWMA is a part of the Water Quality Watch Centre to identify the necessary software for online monitoring of water discharges from the industries.

Our Chairman, Mr. Mani is a member of the Research & Development Committee of TNPCB.

IWMA has also participated in the Consultative program conducted by CII- Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) to review the various Waste management rules.

TNPCB has taken note of the high compliance level in the Gummidipoondi CHWTSDF and wishes IWMA to take lead in the area of Food Waste Management also. IWMA is a Member of the Technical & Coordination committees of Food Waste Management initiated by TNPCB.

Your Association is also in the Online Consent Management and Monitoring System (OCMMS) committee for Hazardous Waste and had participated in MoEF discussions.

#### **TRAINING:**

Your Association has felt the importance of training Environment Management operatives of the Member industries. To begin with, the Association has scheduled Awareness Training on Environmental Laws in association with TNPCB. We have conducted two such programs in Chennai in February & March 2016. The training sessions were well received by the Members and we have planned to conduct this program in other districts like Coimbatore, Hosur, Madurai, etc.

#### **In-House Training Programs:**

We have also plans to conduct in-house training programs in IWMA office premises on various environmental, quality and safety related topics. The program will focus on small groups to facilitate better understanding and involvement.

#### **Certification Programs:**

IWMA has planned to conduct Operator certification program for various industrial sectors. To start with, IWMA is in the process of developing curriculum for Textile industries (Dyeing). We are in discussion with SSM Polytechnic College, Erode to conduct the program on ETP operation, maintenance, controls and documentation requirements. The programs envisages on the job training at the relevant industrial sites and lab scale training on analysis of various parameters.

In the forthcoming years, your Association is keen to develop a structured skill development course in the field of environment.

#### **Accreditation**

Your organization is preparing for Accreditation of Business Membership Organization (Industry Association) by the National Accreditation Board for Education and Training (NABET), Quality Council of India (QCI). This is an Accreditation standard like ISO systems.

#### **PROJECTS:**

As a part of industry oriented projects, we have taken up:

- Optimum structural design of Elevated Solar Evaporation Pan by IIT-M
- Feasibility study of Marine disposal of RO reject salts (IIT-M, NIOT, WAPCOS)
- Design of ETP for a Polymer Textile industry (CLRI)
- Colour removal from Textile effluent (CLRI)
- Recycling of Fly Ash from wood-fired boilers (CLRI)

These are at various stages of completion.

#### **VICE-CHAIRMAN:**

In line with the last AGM resolution Mr. A.C. Saravanan (representing Indian Additives Ltd. Membership No: 42), has been nominated as Vice Chairman, by the Executive Committee. Besides being involved in Environment Management in his company, he has served as Joint Secretary of your Association for 2 years.

#### **OFFICE PREMISES:**

In the December floods, IWMA office premises were completely inundated with irreparable damage to the furniture, office equipment and documents. However, we were able to recover most of the legal documents and electronic data. Finance documents like bills, vouchers and correspondence records were beyond recovery. With dedicated staff, the office was functional within a week's time.

In light of the damages and requirement for additional space to accommodate our Governing Body and staff, the office premises was shifted to an 1800sqft furnished premises in West Mambalam. The conference hall (with a capacity for 24) will be used for Executive Meetings and in-house training sessions.

#### **CSR ACTIVITIES:**

As a part of our CSR activities, ENVIRO competitions, in partnership with Science Olympiad Foundation, were conducted on the 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> of July 2015 in ICSR Auditorium in IIT-M. It has attracted participation of 250 students from 70 schools.

Y E S Awards 2016, an innovation triggering event for schools, mentored by Prof. Natarajan of IIT-M was conducted from July 2015 to January 2016. Over 40 projects have been presented and the best projects were awarded on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2016 by Prof. A. K. Mishra, Dean, Academic Research, IIT- Madras.

Teaming with CII, CII-Yi, and TES-AMM, ECAP, an E-waste awareness program was conducted on 29<sup>th</sup> February 2016 in ICSR auditorium of IIT-M. 75 schools participated in the event.

#### **CHWTSDF:**

We are proud to share with you that **Thiru. K. C. Karuppannan**, the Honorable Minister for Environment and Pollution Control, Government of Tamil Nadu visited and inspected the Common Hazardous Waste Treatment Storage and Disposal Facility at Gummidipoondi on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2016. The Minister expressed his appreciation for the efforts taken for safe disposal of hazardous waste.

#### **ABOUT IWMA**

The Environmental Protection Act, 1986 sets the onus of identifying the sites for Common Hazardous Waste Treatment Storage and Disposal Facility (CHWTSDF) to the State Governments. In line with the directive from Honorable Supreme Court of India, the Government of Tamil Nadu, through Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB), formed a core group of representatives from the industries in Tamil Nadu to coordinate the establishment of CHWTSDF in 1999.

In this context, at the behest of TNPCB, Industrial Waste Management Association (IWMA) was set up as a Not for Profit Organization in 2002, with initial strength of 35 members from various industries. From 2002 to 2007, the Association was coordinating the assessment and clearance of various sites along with the Government of Tamil Nadu. During this period, IWMA was functioning from the premises of Orchid Chemicals in Cathedral Road. An Executive Committee of nine members met on a monthly basis to build the framework of the Association.

The Govt. of Tamil Nadu, through SIPCOT leased ~27 acres of land at Gummidipoondi to IWMA to establish a CHWTSDF. IWMA engaged Ramky group to establish and operate a CHWTSDF (first common hazardous waste landfill facility in the state) through Tamil Nadu Waste Management Ltd for industries in Tamil Nadu. The landfill facility is amongst the best maintained hazardous waste disposal sites in the country. With the establishment of CHWTSDF in Gummidipoondi Export Promotion zone in ~27 acres by 2008, the membership increased to more than 100; the Association felt the need for an organized office. With prime focus on coordinating the operation of a secure landfill facility, a highly experienced scientist with industrial field experience was inducted as Executive Secretary along with an office assistant. The Registered Office was shifted to a rented premise in Ashok Nagar. Over a period of years, the Association registered a tremendous growth in membership to nearly 2200 at present.

At present, the Association functions at a new office premise in Brindavan Street, West Mambalam. The current strength of the Executive Committee is 16 with members from diverse industrial categories who have considerable expertise in the field of environment and/or practicing professionals. In addition, IWMA has experienced Advisors who guide and help implement the activities of the Association.

Besides periodic review of the landfill site operation, IWMA conducts Seminars, training programs-and offers consultancy services to industries/ industry clusters in partnership with institutions such as Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI), Chennai and IIT-Madras on environmental issues related to air, water and waste management.

TWMA has been actively involved in creating awareness among school children in areas of environment, renewable energy, recycling, climate change, water conservation and global warming.

IWMA conducts "ENVIRO" program in collaboration with Science Olympiad Foundation for school children. Competitive events like Collage Making, Just a minute, Debate, Poster Making, Best out of Waste are held to promote the importance of environment among school children.

IWMA annually conducts "Young Environmental Scientist" program under the guidance of Prof T. S. Natarajan (formerly Professor at IIT-Madras, now Professor at IIT-Tirupathi) for promoting scientific research interest among school children from 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> standard from private schools as well as Corporation of Chennai Schools.

Another initiative of IWMA is an "ECAP (E-Waste Collection and Awareness Program)" covering schools in the city has been taken up in partnership with CII-YI and Tes-Amm Recyclers.


Besides the above, IWMA offers the following services:

- Guidance for submission of Consent order application to TNPCB




#### MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION GROWTH



IWMA is in the process of developing training modules. During the previous financial year (2015-2016), 2 such programs were conducted and respective modules have been developed.


#### 1. Hazardous Waste Management @ Hotel Bhimaas, Chennai -12th & 13th Feb 2016.


#### 2. Regulatory Requirements & OCMMS @ IIT Madras, Chennai - 22nd March 2016

#### **ENVIRO 2015**

Every year IWMA in collaboration with Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF) conducts ENVIRO - a two day environmental awareness program for school children. Competitive events like Collage making, Just a minute, Debate, Poster making, Best out of waste, Adzap and model displays are held to promote the importance of environment among school children. Dr. Sultan Ahmed Ismail, M.Sc., Ph.D., D.Sc., Soil Biologist and Ecologist from Eco Science Foundation was invited as the Chief Guest for the event.






#### **YOUNG ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTISTS AWARDS - YES 2016**

IWMA conducts an inter-school (Classes 8 to 12) research oriented competitionfor school children, since 2012, called YOUNG ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST (Y E S). This is a Quest for young minds, who are intent on shaping Tomorrow, today. Prof. Natarajan of IIT (M) mentors the students and their guides on the modality of Research, viz. Observation, Experimentation, Data Collection & Analysis. The program is run over 6 months from the selection of the project through experiment and data analysis to demonstration. Besides the students, their mentors are also recognized for their contribution.

Y E S Awards-2016 was conducted on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2016 at IC & SR Conference Hall, IIT Madras. Over 40 projects were presented. Prof. Natrajan, Dr. S. Kavita, Fibsol, IITM Research Park and Dr. Manu Jaiswal, IIT-M evaluated the projects. Prof. A. K. Mishra (Dean Academic Research, IITM), the Chief Guest for the program, distributed the prizes to the winners.

#### COMPLETED PROJECTS

#### Design of ETP for a Polymer Textile industry at Chennai

#### **BACKGROUND**

Industrial Waste Management Association (IWMA) has identified Environmental Technology Division in CSIR-CLRI as its consultant to solve the environmental issues emerged in industries in Tamil Nadu. IWMA and CSIR-CLRI have been rendering their service from March, 2011. CSIR-CLRI offers solutions to manage liquid, solid and gaseous wastes generated in industries in Tamil Nadu.

Advance high efficient wastewater filtration plant, designed and developed by Dr. G. Sekaran, Environmental Technology Division, CSIR – CLRI was inaugurated by Mr. Ulrich Scherbel, General Manager – GBD Apparel, FPM in presence of Dr. B. Chandrasekaran, Director, CSIR – CLRI along with IWMA chairman and members on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2016, Chennai (Fig. 1 and Fig. 1).

#### Structural Design for Elevated Solar Pan

#### BACKGROUND

In Effluent Treatment Plants, Solar Evaporation Pan (SEP) is one of the components which is used to dry final reject. If SEP is built directly on ground, there is a possibility that concentrated effluent present in SEP might leak through cracks developed on SEP floor. Since SEP is built on ground, it is not possible to verify whether any leakage is happening.

Hence, Tamil Nadu State Pollution Control Board has started insisting to build Elevated Solar Evaporation Pan (ESEP) which is at least 1.2 m above ground level. This elevated structure will ensure that any leakages in the ESEP can be easily identified and rectified.

#### THE PROJECT

Hence, for the benefit of all its members, the Industrial Waste Management Association (IWMA) joined hands with Department of Civil Engineering, IIT-Madras to develop the optimal civil structure for ESEP.

IWMA engaged Ms. Rajeswari Jupalli, a B.Tech- Civil Engineering student at IIT- Madras, for carrying out the project under the guidance of Prof. Devdas Menon.

For designing the Solar Evaporation Pan combinations of the following four parameters were considered: Height of structure above ground level, Breadth, Length and Soil bearing capacity.

All designs were done as per Method IS 456:2000, including serviceability checks. The detailed report with a total of 850 ESEP civil designs was submitted to IWMA.

The report contains a total of 840 ESEP designs for maximum effluent storage of 15mm.


